



The Guernsey Photography Festival is proud to announce its 2011 programme, which brings together major names in international photography with a host of emerging talent, for a packed month of exhibitions, workshops and events on the beautiful island of Guernsey.

Taking place from 1 – 30 June 2011, the festival presents exhibitions by Martin Parr (UK), Richard Billingham (UK), Samuel Fosso (Cameroon), Carolyn Drake (USA), Francesco Giusti

(Italy), Adam Patterson (N. Ireland),

Dana Popa (Romania), Nelli Palomäki

(Finland) and a retrospective by

influential '60s British documentary photographer Tony Ray-Jones.

This year's festival explores the theme of IDENTITY and will reveal a multitude of interpretations from personal to social and political. From Francesco Giusti's Congolese dandies in colourful suits, to Carolyn Drake's compelling documentation of the changing landscapes and communities of Central Asia's 'Paradise Rivers', and Samuel Fosso and Nelli Palomäki's striking takes on classic portraits, notions of self and place are presented in diverse contexts.

Many of the participating photographers will visit Guernsey to take part in a series of talks.

Offering more than 30 exhibitions and almost 30 recreational and educational events, Guernsey Photography Festival has been made possible thanks to the second year of support from principal festival partners Generali Worldwide and PPF Partners. Also sponsoring the festival this year are Cenkos and Mourant Ozannes, associate partner Guernsey Arts Commission and associate sponsor Deutsche Bank.

This year's festival is dedicated to Tim Hetherington, one of our guest photographers last year, who tragically lost his life while covering the escalating violence in Misrata (Libya). Our thoughts also go to American photographer Chris Hondros who died in the same circumstances.



Richard Billingham_UK RAY'S A LAUGH/NEW WORK

Richard Billingham shot to fame in 1996 with his groundbreaking photographic series Ray's a Laugh, extraordinary pictures of family life in his childhood home, a tower block in Cradley Heath, West Midlands. Ray's a Laugh was exhibited internationally and featured in the pivotal show, Sensation (1997) at the Royal Academy of Arts.

He was awarded the Citibank (now Deutsche Börse) Photography Prize that year, and was nominated for the Turner Prize in 2001. He has continued to photograph his family, and presented a major new body of work in 2010.

An ongoing engagement with landscape has seen Billingham working in Britain (Norfolk, 'Constable Country' in Suffolk, the South Downs, Black Country, the Gower)

and further afield (Ethiopia, Greece, Germany, Pakistan). In his series of photographic and video works entitled Zoo (2001-2006) he explored the lives of animals in captivity.

His work is held in numerous private and public collections worldwide, including Tate, the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, etc.

Richard Billingham's acclaimed and controversial portraits, Ray's a Laugh, which depict an honest and searing account of his parents' troubled home-life, will be presented together for the first time with new work portraying his own young family. Also shown will be a series of videos produced by the artist in the late 90s.





Carolyn Drake_USA PARADISE RIVERS

Carolyn Drake is a documentary photographer based in Istanbul. Her photo career began at the age of 30 when she decided to leave her multimedia job in New York to learn about the world through personal experience. Since 2007, she has explored the politics, cultures, environment and ideas of progress in Central Asia; a vast territory nestled between Russia, China, Afghanistan, and Iran. Drake is the recipient of a

Fulbright fellowship to Ukraine, the Lange Taylor Documentary prize, and a Guggenheim fellowship.

Her work is regularly published in international magazines such as National Geographic and New York The acclaimed American photographer presents Paradise Rivers, which follows the Amu and Syr Darya rivers of Central Asia from their source in the valleys of the Pamir and Tien Shan mountains, downstream across Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, and Kazakhstan to their Admission Free dwindling ends, crossing into the lives of people and layers of history that they intersect along the way. 

then lived in Nigeria as a child but was forced to leave at the end of the Biafran war in 1972. He moved to Bangui, in the Central African Republic, the artist inhabiting various icons of where he found work as an assistant photographer. Six months later, aged 13, he opened his own photographic portrait studio. Fosso started taking self-portraits to send to his mother in Nigeria, whom he had left behind as a refugee. Although his initial aim was to show he was alive and well, his interest in exploring the genre grew steadily, and he experimented with new techniques and poses.

Fosso's work has been published around the world, and shown in major global venues such as the Photographers Gallery, London and the Guggenheim Museum, New York.

Samuel Fosso was born in Cameroon, Samuel Fosso, one of Africa's most eminent photographers, will exhibit his African Spirits and Tati series of self-portraits. African Spirits presents black identity, from cultural leaders to the civil rights movement, including Martin Luther King, Malcolm X and Muhammad Ali. The Tati series shows Fosso dressed up as fictionalised characters..

Martin Parr is a photographer, editor, collector and curator who offers a critique of the modern world by expressing its ambiguities. He is widely regarded as the most successful photographer of his generation with work held in many national collections and exhibited and published around the world.

Tony Ray-Jones_UK THE ENGLISH

Tony Ray-Jones studied at the London Tony Ray-Jones exhibition on Market School of Printing before obtaining a scholarship at Yale University of Art in eccentricities of the British leisure the early 1960s. A five-year period in the USA and his studies at Yale were of great importance to his artistic development. When he returned to Britain in 1965 he travelled around seaside towns, villages, cities and festivals to survey the English at leisure, trying to document the English way of life 'before it became too Americanised'. His documentary photographs are full of a somewhat surreal humour and show the influence of American photographers such as Henri-Cartier Bresson and Garry Winogrand.

Sadly Tony Ray-Jones was diagnosed with leukemia in 1971 and died at the young age of 30. It was only in 2004 that his work received a full retrospective exhibition at the National Media Museum of Photography in Bradford, England.




Jocelyn Allen_UK REALITY OF YOUTH.../ONE IS NOT LIKE THE OTHER





So Part A will be classroom-based looking at some examples in my own work and the work of others; Part B will involve taking cameras out at unsociable hours and Part C will mean some technical tips about low light and crepuscular photography. Working for a day with me means classroom sessions with me in the daytime, then photography in the early evening light, photography in the late evening using artificial light and then back out for a bright and fresh 4am start for the dawn light. Sleeping is for wimps! Attendants can try to get hold of a light meter, or warm clothes, or head torch or strong shoes but everybody will most definitely need a good tripod." -Simon Norfolk.




